Students receive \$10k boost to support STEM study

- The Smith Family's Learning for Life program gets \$10,000 boost from **BASF**
- Disadvantaged secondary students receive educational support

The program offers a combination of financial support, for educational essentials like school uniforms, books and excursions; personalized support from a Smith Family Coordinator and access to our out-of-school learning and mentoring programs."

"BASF's generous support means 12 students in the local community will receive the help they need to succeed at school and break the cycle of disadvantage," said Dr. O'Brien.

BASF has donated over \$500,000 since first forming its partnership with The Smith Family in 2004.

BASF also supports The Smith Family's *Let's Count* mathematics program for early years' educators. Through the program, educators support parents with tips, techniques and resources to emphasize math in daily life and help children to see it as relevant, stimulating and fun.
