Lump sum nomination (please complete Section A overleaf)

- For active members as at 31 March 2012 who continue to be employed by BASF, the lump sum will be a multiple of your pensionable salary, depending on the terms and conditions of your employment, plus the value of your AVC account (excluding AVCs used to buy an additional partner's pension) (if you have one).
- For deferred members, the lump sum will be a refund of the contributions you paid into the Scheme plus the value of your AVC account (excluding AVCs used to buy an additional partner's pension).
- For pensioners, the lump sum represents the outstanding balance of five years' pension payments (disregarding future increases) and is payable only if you die within the first five years of your retirement and you do not have a spouse.

Partner's pension (please complete Section B overleaf)

The Scheme will normally pay a pension to your spouse or civil partner on your death. However, if you do not have a spouse or civil partner, or if you no longer live with them, you can nominate your current partner to receive this pension instead, subject to Trustee consent.

Important note:

Remember to keep your nomination form up to date. If your circumstances change, it is your responsibility to submit a revised form. The Trustee may not be able to pay a pension to a partner who is not named in Section B of this form.

Section B: Partner's pension

If, as at 31 March 2012, you were an active member of the defined benefit Group Section of the BASF UK Group Pension Scheme, and you continue to be employed by BASF, the Trustee will normally pay a pension to your nominated partner on your death (please refer to the 'defined benefit section: member guide' for details of how much pension may be payable). You should also note the details of any Supplementary Guide issued to you in 2012 when the DB Section closed.

However, if you do not have a spouse or civil partner, or if you no longer live with them, you can nominate your current partner to receive this spouse's pension on your death subject to Trustee consent. Your partner must be someone you live with at the date of your death, in an enduring relationship and who is financially dependent on you or inter-dependent on you. The Trustee's decision on whether your partner meets this criteria is final.

Please note that if you are married or have entered into a registered civil partnership when you die, contracted-out benefits must be used to provide pensions for your legal widow/er or civil partner in accordance with regulations.

Also, please note that if you were an active member of the Scheme as at 31 March 2012 and you continue to be employed by BASF, the payment of a pension to your partner will mean that any children's pensions (which would otherwise have been increased due to no spouse's pension being paid) will NOT be increased.
