It meets annually with the members of BASF's Board of Executive Directors to critically evaluate and refine the sustainability management of BASF on the basis of a shared dialogue.

Peter Bakker Peter Bakker is the President and CEO of the World Business Council for Sustainable Development (WBCSD). He is a distinguished business leader who until June 2011, was the CEO of TNT NV, the global transport and postal company. He has been recipient of the Global Citizen Award (2009) and the Sustainability Leadership Award (2010). Mr. Bakker is a UN Global Ambassador Against Hunger, a SDG 12.3 Champion and Chairman of WarChild in the Netherlands. He co-chairs one of the Sustainable Development Solutions Network's thematic networks as well as the UN Sustainable Development Solutions Network and is Vice-chairman of the International Integrated Reporting Council.



Dr Jim Fava is Chief Strategist at Anthesis Group. With over 25 years of experiences in the sustainability space, he helps the world's businesses scale sustainability. Dr Fava has been called the 'father of modern-day life cycle assessment'. He co-founded Five Winds International, which merged with PE (now thinkstep), founded the Product Sustainability Roundtable, co-founded the SETAC LCA Advisory Group, co-founded and played key roles within the UNEP/SETAC Life Cycle Initiative and co-chaired its Hotspot Analysis Flagship Project, and is Executive Director of the Forum for Sustainability through Life Cycle Innovation e.V. (FSLCI).



Ralf Fücks is the founder and Director of The Center for Liberal Modernity, a starting think tank based in Berlin. From 1996 to 2017, he was President of the Heinrich-Böll-Foundation, a German think tank and international policy network, with focus on sustainable development and green growth, welfare state, migration, the future of Europe, and foreign policy. He served as a Deputy Mayor for Urban Development and Environmental Protection in the City State of Bremen. Ralf Fücks contributes regularly to national and international media, including his books *Green Growth, Smart Growth* (2014) and *Freiheit verteidigen* (2017, English edition to follow).



Dr Margaret Jungk leads BSR's global human rights practice and has over 20 years' experience working with multinational companies and international institutions on human rights and sustainability. Prior to joining BSR, Dr Jungk held a special appointment from the United Nations and served as the first Chair of the UN Working Group on Business and Human Rights, and Chair of the World Economic Forum's Global Agenda Council on Human Rights. Margaret Jungk was the founder and director of the Business Department at the Danish Institute for Human Rights, and holds a PhD (1998) from Cambridge University specializing in human rights.

He is the author of *Consumptionomics: Asia's Role in reshaping Capitalism and Saving the Planet* and creator of *The Other Hundred*, a non-profit book project which serves as a counterpoint to the Forbes 100 and other media rich lists.
