FAQ

Q1. Can one team work on more than one experiment and submission?

No, ONLY one experiment can be submitted per team.

Q2. In what language should the proposal be submitted?

- All proposals, presentations and other materials should be in English ONLY.

Q3. Who are the judges?

The judging panel is comprised of BASF management and regional subject matter experts as well as professors from the Department of Chemistry, CUHK.

Q4. How will the winning team be selected?

We will look at the following aspects of each proposal to shortlist entrants and determine the winners:

- Feasibility of adaptation*
**The experiment should be completed within 45 minutes (excluding preparation time)*
- Attention to age suitability
- Sustainability elements
- Educational purpose
- Fun factors
- Safety considerations
- Creativity and originality of the experiment
- Level of team work / co-creation
- Presentation and communication skills

Q5. Can we not have our names and/or proposal published?

No. In order to be fair to other applicants, you must agree that you allow your names and proposal to be announced and published.

Q6. Once the competition has ended, then what?

CUHK and BASF will explore with the winners further on developing the submitted experiment to become part of the Kids' Lab program.
